4	Funding Requests – For Approval	<b>TL:</b> TL introduced their Funding Proposal for Language Cafes. Agreement from those in the room to approve the funding.	<b>JB</b> to circulate funding request for approval
5	Referenda – For approval	<ul> <li>Proposed Referendum 1 - The Guild should remain a member of the National Union of Students UK (NUS UK). (Note, not NUS Charity)</li> <li>BL: BL introduced and proposed the referendum question on NUS UK membership.</li> <li>BL: Outlined the context behind the proposal regarding the recent report into Anti-Semitism within the NUS and the feeling that students should have their say about the Guild remaining members.</li> <li>RIS: Question: How many other Students' Unions have voted to disaffiliate this year?</li> <li>JB: A number of Students' Unions have held referenda on this. Some haven't reach quoracy or didn't pass. About five are planning to run referenda?</li> <li>BL: Proposed timelines that were suggested by Student Voice are in the attached paper – either April or October.</li> <li>RIS: Question: How would we do the educational piece that would be needed to ensure that students are aware of the context around the referenda?</li> <li>BL: Doing three referenda at once would enable us to properly educate students about the different topics.</li> <li>AM: AM pointed out that they hadn't heard from any students in response to the KC's report. There's has been some talk among the student body but nothing directly to the Guild.</li> <li>RIS: We don't see a huge amount of engagement with the NUS. Is there a general</li> </ul>	JB to circulate online votes alongside minutes of the meeting for decision on the proposed referenda and dates.

<b>BL:</b> We should give students the opportunity to	
choose. If we wait until October then it may have	
passed out of general knowledge within the	
student population.	
<b>AM</b> : The report has only just been published	
and the NUS will need time to implement the	
recommendations. We should consider waiting	
until October to give them time to do this.	
There was general discussion on holding a	
referendum in April or October.	
<b>RIS</b> : Question: If the can the current Guild	
Officer Group decide to hold a referendum for	
after their term has ended?	
<b>JB:</b> JB clarified that the By-laws allow the Guild	
Officer Group to decide when referenda are held	
and nothing voids this decision once their term	
ends. The next Guild Officer Group could decide	
that they don't want to hold the referendum.	
<b>RIS</b> : There's general agreement on holding the	
referenda, most of the discussion in on when to	
hold it.	
<b>JB</b> : JB clarified that the meeting wouldn't be	
able to decide now on whether to hold the	
referenda as they need a 75% majority.	
<b>AM:</b> As we can't agree this now it'll need to be done via an online vote. We'll also need to	
decide when to hold the referendum.	
<b>JB</b> : JB clarified the specifics of the desired vote.	
<b>JB</b> : To circulate vote on holding a referendum	
on the Guild remaining a member of NUS UK,	
and a vote on whether the hold the referendum	
in April or October.	
Proposed Referendum 2 - The Guild should	
support the University and College Union (UCU)	
in their current dispute over pay, pensions, and	
conditions.	
<b>BL:</b> BL presented the proposed referendum	
question on supporting the UCU disputes.	

		<ul> <li>RIS: Question: Why are we looking at running this referendum now? The current referendum doesn't run out for another year.</li> <li>BL: The nature of the disputes has changed since the original referendum was held. The Marking and Assessment Boycott wasn't being considered then.</li> <li>RIS: Question: What is the potential of the disputes being resolved?</li> <li>JB: JB outlined the current place where the disputes were at with ACAS negotiations on the Four Fights and the upcoming valuation on USS pensions.</li> <li>BL: Holding the referendum in April would allow for the new Officer Team to have a renewed mandate of support and for students to consider their stance in light of the proposed Marking and Assessment Boycott.</li> <li>JB: UCU is currently re-balloting, and will need to win the re-ballot in order to hold a Marking and Assessment Boycott.</li> <li>AM: AM suggested changing the wording of the question as it currently refers to individual disputes – "pay, pensions and conditions".</li> <li>BL: We could remove the last few words so it reads "The Guild should support the University and College Union (UCU) in their current disputes with employers".</li> <li>Agreement from the room to change the wording.</li> <li>JB: To circulate vote on holding a referendum on support for the UCU disputes.</li> </ul>
